

Words in More Than One Word Class

Identifying **word classes** can sometimes be *easy peasy lemon squeezy*.

Take the word **hat**, for example. The word **hat** can only be a noun. Simple!

Unfortunately, some words are in more than one word class – depending on how they are used in the sentence. The word **walk**, for example, can be both a verb and a noun.

I'm a verb.

I **walk** to school in the morning.

I went for a **walk**.

I'm a noun.
